10/22/13 -- August 2013 Construction at \$915.1 Billion Annual Rate

The delayed U.S. Census Bureau of the Department of Commerce figures were announced today that construction spending during August 2013 was estimated at a seasonally adjusted annual rate of \$915.1 billion, 0.6 percent **above** the revised July estimate of \$909.4 billion. The August figure is 7.1 percent **above** the August 2012 estimate of \$854.0 billion. During the first 8 months of this year, construction spending amounted to \$581.9 billion, 5.9 percent **above** the \$549.4 billion for the same period in 2012.

PRIVATE CONSTRUCTION: Spending on private construction was at a seasonally adjusted annual rate of \$640.5 billion, 0.7 percent **above** the revised July estimate of \$636.1 billion. Residential construction was at a seasonally adjusted annual rate of \$340.2 billion in August, 1.2 percent **above** the revised July estimate of \$336.2 billion. Nonresidential construction was at a seasonally adjusted annual rate of \$300.3 billion in August, 0.1 percent **above** the revised July estimate of \$299.9 billion.

<u>PUBLIC CONSTRUCTION</u>: In August, the estimated seasonally adjusted annual rate of public construction spending was \$274.5 billion, 0.4 percent **above** the revised July estimate of \$273.4 billion. Educational construction was at a seasonally adjusted annual rate of \$63.8 billion, 1.3 percent <u>below</u> the revised July estimate of \$64.6 billion. Highway construction was at a seasonally adjusted annual rate of \$80.6 billion, 0.1 percent **above** the revised July estimate of \$80.5 billion.
